B'RIT CHADASHA NEW TESTAMENT	SIX DAYS BEFORE PASSOVER (John 12:1) Y'shua comes to Bethany to Lazarus' home. Martha prepares a supper, and Mary anoints the feet of Y'shua (John 12:3-11).	FIVE DAYS BEFORE PASSOVER THE NEXT DAY (John 12:12) Y'shua makes His Triumphal Entry into Jerusalem in fulfillment of Micah 5:2 (Matthew 21:12; Mark 11:1-10). He beholds the city and weeps over it (Luke 19:41). Afterwards He goes out of the city with the Twelve at even (Matthew 21:17)	FOUR DAYS BEFORE PASSOVER ON THE MORROW (Mark 11:12) On the way to Jerusalem, Y'shua curses the fig tree (Mark 11:13). Then He drives the money changers from the Temple (Mark 11:15). He spends time teaching (Luke 19:47), and when evening comes, He goes out of the city (Mark 11:19)	THREE DAYS BEFORE PASSOVER IN THE MORNING (Mark 11:20) AFTER TWO DAYS IS THE FEAST OF PASSOVER (Mark 14:1) Y'shua comes again to Jerusalem and finds the fig tree dried up (Mark 11:20). He spends time teaching and giving parables in the Temple (Mark 11:20; 14:1). He predicts His forthcoming death and prophesies of the destruction of Jerusalem and other events (Matthew 24; Mark 13; Luke 21). The second anointing in Bethany takes place at the house of Simon the leper (Mark 14:3-9). Judas plots to betray Y'shua (Mark 14:10).	TWO DAYS BEFORE PASSOVER FIRST DAY OF UNLEAVENED BREAD WHEN THEY KILLED THE PASSOVER (Mark 14:12) The disciples prepare the Pesach lamb and the upper room for Y'shua to eat the Passover (Mark 14:12-18)

<p>THE PREPARATION DAY BEFORE THE SABBATH (Mark 15:42)</p> <p>“In the evening He cometh with the twelve,” (Mark 14:17) and eats the Passover lamb supper with them (Matt. 26:26-29; Luke 22:14-23). He then goes with the disciples to Gethsemane for prayer (Mark 14:32). Immediately thereafter He is betrayed by Judas (Mark 14:43), and captured by the high priest and taken for trial before Caiaphas (Luke 22:54).</p>		<p>DAY OF UNLEAVENED BREAD CALLED THE PASSOVER (Luke 22:1; Matthew 27:62)</p> <p>FIRST NIGHT AND DAY OF ENTOMBMENT</p> <p>On this yearly Sabbath High Day (John 19:31), the chief priests request that a watch be established at the tomb and that it be sealed for three days (Matthew 27:62-66)</p>		<p>SECOND DAY OF UNLEAVENED BREAD</p> <p>SECOND NIGHT AND DAY OF ENTOMBMENT</p> <p>On this day, spices are purchased and prepared to anoint the body of Y’shua (Luke 23:56)</p>		<p>THIRD DAY OF UNLEAVENED BREAD</p> <p>THIRD NIGHT AND DAY OF ENTOMBMENT</p> <p>The people rest on the Sabbath day according to the commandment (Luke 23:56). Then at dusk at the end of the Sabbath (Havdalah), the resurrected Y’shua comes forth from the tomb.</p>		<p>FOURTH DAY OF UNLEAVENED BREAD FIRSTFRUITS</p> <p>EVIDENCE HE IS RISEN</p> <p>In the pre-dawn hours, Miriam is the first to see the risen Messiah, but she is instructed not to touch Him (John 20:7). Then, Y’shua ascends to the Father with the perfect, eternal sacrificial body and assuming the role of High Priest, offers the wave sheaf of the firstfruits of the resurrection whom He had led captive (Eph. 4:10; Matt. 27:53; 1 Cor. 15:23). Later Y’shua appears to various disciples, and to two on the road to Emmaus. They remark that three days elapsed since all things concerning the death of Y’shua had transpired.</p>			
<p>PASSOVER NIGHT</p> <p>Israel ate the Pesach as instructed and remained in their homes until morning, also as instructed. (Exodus 12:22,28)</p>		<p>PASSOVER DAY</p> <p>During the day of the fourteenth of <i>Aviv</i>, they spoiled the Egyptians (Exodus 12:35)</p>		<p>FIRST DAY OF UNLEAVENED BREAD - A YEARLY SABBATH</p> <p>The children of Israel left Egypt by night on the fifteenth of <i>Aviv</i> (Numbers 33:2; Deut. 16:1)</p>		<p>THE WEEKLY SABBATH</p> <p>At sundown begins the weekly Sabbath.</p>		<p>THE NEW WEEK FEAST OF FIRSTFRUITS</p> <p>After sundown begins the new week (after Havdalah). The priest gathers the wave sheaf of Barley (Lev. 23:11).</p>		<p>THE MORROW AFTER THE SABBATH AFTER PASSOVER</p> <p>The wave sheaf was waved in the temple before the Lord.</p>
