The Hebrew Lunar year consists of 354 days, 48 full weeks or 336 days, and 18 days of Holidays {7-Pesach/Chag-HaMatzot, 1-Shavuot, 1-Yom Teruah, 1-Yom Kippur, 7-Sukkot, 1-Shemini Atzeret} [Abib-30, Iyyar-29, 30-Sivan, 29-Tamuz, 30-Av, 29-Elul, 30-Tishri, 29-Cheshvan, 30-Kislev, 29-Tevet, 30-Sh'vat, 29-Adar]. From Tishri 23 until Abib 14 there are 168 days or 24 weeks. Everyone served during the eight days of Pesach. From Abib 22 to Tishri 14 there are 170 days, that is, 168 days or 24 weeks + 2 days since everyone served during Shavuot & Yom Kippur. Everyone also served from Tishri 15-22, during Sukkot & Shemini Atzeret.
